Albany Diocesan Cemeteries has selected Carrier Mausoleums Construction USA, Inc. to construct their new community mausoleum in St. Agnes Cemetery in Menands, New York.

St. Agnes Cemetery

The new mausoleum was designed by the architectural firms of Schoepfer Architects of Syracuse, New York, in conjunction with Cataldo, Waters, and Griffith of Schenectady, New York.

Constructed into a hillside, the building contains an interior garden level and a terrace

> level with an interior open balcony. There are also several sections of exterior crypts.

The crypt inventory totals 969 casket spaces, comprised of a variety of different types, including single, tandem, as well as slide-over crypts. In addition, there is a wide selection of cremation niche spaces including both marble fronted niches as well as internally illuminated bronze and glass niches.





The interior crypt shutters will be finished with an attractive combination of polished marbles, including Bianco Carrara, Biancone Apricena, and highlighted with Verde Issorie for the trim and couch crypt shutters. The exterior crypt shutters will be finished with polished Plum Rose granite.

Religious significance will be provided for the project with the incorporation of the Stations of the Cross on fourteen bronze shutter fronts. There are also four large carved wood icon panels commemorating the North American Saints.

There is liberal use of premium finishes throughout the mausoleum, including western red cedar on the interior ceilings and brick veneer on the exterior walls. Topping off the building is a standing seam copper roof.

Construction commenced on April 15, 2002 and is due to be completed by November 30, 2002.





PROJECTS

The Promontory Green Interment Garden, located in Kelowna, B.C., has recently been completed and was inaugurated on May 12th, 2002. This garden has been designed by Hilton Landmarks Inc. and the execution started late November 2001 and was completed within 3 months.

The project includes 900 niches and 60 crypts to meet the area's high rate of cremation as well as optimizing the land use

of the cemetery. A waterfall combined with pristine landscaping and the classical copper dome add majesty and tradition to the Kelowna Memorial Park Cemetery.



This project was a combination of veined granite – Kelowna Silver Mist – as well as precast and poured-in-place concrete.

We truly appreciated the cooperation and relationship that has been developed with the City of Kelowna through this successful accomplishment.
