THE WOODLAWN CEMETERY CONSERVATORY MAUSOLEUM

Carrier Mausoleums Construction U.S.A., Inc. has been selected to construct the Woodlawn Cemetery Conservatory Mausoleum in the Bronx, New York. This is Carrier's first project in New York City and is due to commence in early 2003, with completion in early 2004.

The mausoleum contains 2,326 casket spaces and 200 niche spaces and features three large courtyards, a fountain, angel statue, and large roof skylights for an abundance of natural light to shine on the flowers, small trees and shrubs planted throughout.

The project was designed by Barry Boudreaux and John Gary of J. Stuart Todd, Inc. working with the Woodlawn management team of John Toale, Jonathan Butler and the Building and Grounds Committee of

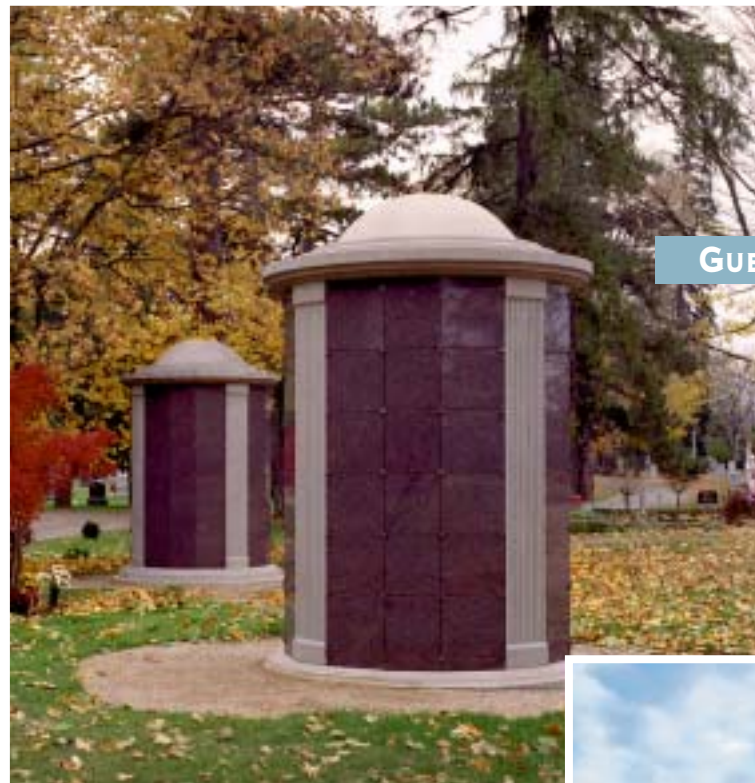
GROVESIDE CEMETERY

OUR LADY IMMACULATE MAUSOLEUM, PHASE II

On May 25, 2002, Most Reverend Anthony F. Tonnos, Bishop of Hamilton blessed the second phase of Our Lady Immaculate Mausoleum in Guelph.

This project, consisting of 596 crypts and 440 niches was Carrier

Mausoleum Constructions first major project for The Catholic Cemeteries of the Diocese of Hamilton. White Carrara marble was used for the crypt fronts, matching the first phase, while Taupolillo marble was introduced for the trim, enhancing the warm atmosphere of the addition. In specially designed alcove areas, bronze statuary of Pope St. Pius X, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux and St. Michael the Archangel have been placed, accenting the religious character of the mausoleum.
